Based on Human Ideas:

Wrong ideas and opinions:

- ⇒ God will accept our best efforts.
- ⇒ Trusting in religious works
- \Rightarrow Living a good life
- \Rightarrow Sin is only a human

Our righteousness before God (Isaiah 64:6; Romans 3.23)

- ⇒ Salvation is an emotional experience
- ⇒ If I don't feel saved, then I must not be saved.
